



Initial Questionnaire

Article 5 of the Procedure of the Argentine National Contact Point (ANCP) for Responsible Business Conduct specifies the requirements that must be included in a submission made by an individual or legal entity who believes that the actions or omissions of a Multinational Enterprise may constitute a failure to comply with the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises on Responsible Business Conduct.

The purpose of this document, which **does not** replace the formal written submission required under Article 5 of the ANCP Procedure, is to facilitate initial contact with the ANCP while ensuring that relevant information is not omitted.

1. Provide the full name or legal name, registered address, identification number, contact

	telephone, and email address of the complainant for proper identification and to allow the ANCP to carry out the necessary communications.
2.	Provide the name , location , and representative of the multinational enterprise alleged to have failed to comply with the Guidelines.





3.	Specify the provisions of the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises that have been or are allegedly not being observed due to the actions or omissions of the multinational enterprise.
4.	Provide a detailed description of the conduct that may constitute a failure to comply with the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises on Responsible Business Conduct . If there are any documents that could support the submitted complaint, please attach them to this questionnaire.
5.	Indicate how the alleged failure to comply with the Guidelines affects the complainant or the person(s) represented by them.





6.	Provide a detailed description of what is expected from the ANCP as a result of the alleged violations or the actions that you consider the company should take to address the complaint.
7.	Describe the prior actions taken with the multinational enterprise to reach agreements, the results obtained, the responses received, and the interlocutors involved.
8.	Indicate the existence and current status of any parallel proceedings , whether judicial or non-judicial, related to the same issues raised in the submitted complaint.
